Attendance will be controlled by advanced ticket sales. The sooner you buy your tickets the better chance you have for seats near the stage, Every seat will be occupied and we should be able to get everyone under the cover of the pavilion while maintaining state mandated table distancing. So go on line to purchase your tickets today or stop by the club during open hours.

MASKS must be worn when not seated at your table, NO EXCEPTIONS. While seated at your table masks can be removed. Also, there is NO SMOKING while under the pavilion. You can go out onto the grass area to smoke where tables are set up.

The ticket cost includes parking on the grounds, (no buses this year), entrance to the grove, fantastic set dinner choices and each night a bit different - and of course music, music, music! Keep in mind, this is a fund raiser for the club to help out our financial situation until the restrictions are over. Be prepared for a really special event! See you at the club!

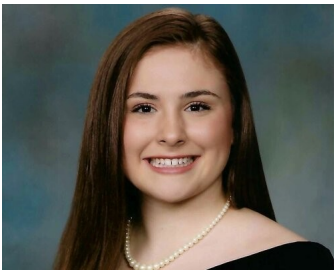


TRAVEL NEWS

it is time to inform you about Oktoberfest Due to the current pandemic, Oktoberfest as we know it must be postponed until 2021. Currently and in the foreseeable future, large crowds are not permitted. Hopefully by next Oktoberfest, the situation with the pandemic will have improved greatly and Oktoberfest can be held as normal. In the meantime, we have bands booked for 4 evenings during this time. I am sure many members have heard of a tentative plan to have fundraising nights with entertainment in lieu of Oktoberfest. There will be more information to share in the coming days but we are planning on having four nights entertainment food and drink. Presale tickets will be required for entry. Tickets will only be offered to Members, however a member may purchase one additional ticket for a guest. The evenings will be September 30th through October 3rd. Let it be known to all that whatever rules are in affect for the state of Pennsylvania, they will be strictly adhered to. Also, face masks will be required. No face mask, no entry. Face masks will be required when not seated at a table. No exceptions. We will be limited to a maximum crowd of 250 people per evening, which includes all employees and volunteers. First Oktoberfest Celebration - Wed 9/30 - Sat 10/3

FOR THIS YEAR'S ANNUAL CELEBRATION IN THE FALL, WE ARE GOING TO CELEBRATE THE FIRST OKTOBERFEST, THE WEDDING OF PRINCE LUDWIG OF BAVARIA AND PRINCESS THERESE OF SAXE-HILDBURGHAUSEN IN 1810. THE TWO WERE MARRIED ON OCTOBER 12TH AND WE WILL BE HOSTING OUR WEDDING PARTY ON WED SEPT 30TH TO SAT OCT 3RD.

Tickets will include admission, parking, dinner, and entertainment. We will have live music each. Oktoberfest is a major fundraiser for the Club as it helps cover expenses through the year and provides support through the Winter. Now this support is needed more than ever as we continue our recovery from being closed for three months and need to look at the rest of 2020.

With the current restriction to 250 people for outdoor events, we have to set ticket prices to cover expenses to put on this year's celebration in October. We will be limiting tickets to around 200 for Members Only and we ask all visitors to be over 21. It is said Prince Ludwig first met Princess Therese and her sister in December 1809. At the time of their meeting, Bavaria was an ally of Napoleonic France and Saxe-Hildburghausen was a smaller part of Napoleon's Confederation of the Rhine. Thur 10/1 - Their Engagement - Our second night will highlight their engagement. Ludwig's father, King Maximilian I Joseph, had to request permission from Emperor Napoleon for his son to marry Therese. This proved not to be a problem as the King was one of Napoleon's closest allies. Ludwig, on the other hand, detested Napoleon. Their engagement was announced on February 12th 1810 and was celebrated in Bavaria. Our Dinner options for Thursday will be either Goulash w/ Noodles and Potato Salad or 1/2 Rotisserie Chicken w/ Potato Salad and Corn on the Cob.

MIKE SURRAT AND THE CONTINENTALS



Fri 10/2 - Their Wedding - Friday Night is going to be our version of October 12th 1810. Their engagement was only 10 months long and was a little earlier than Ludwig had wanted. He would liked to have waited until the beginning of the following year but feared Napoleon would marry him to a French candidate. This prompted him to marry in October. It proved to be a good choice as his bride's and father-in-law's birthdays were around the same time and it allowed the party to be a long one.
